### **Big Sweep Initiatives**

Wake County Big Sweep is a citizendriven, volunteer program dedicated to litter-free communities and waterways focused on water quality and beautification. Thanks to passionate volunteers, Big Sweep has coordinated cleanups in Wake County for over 30 years. These cleanups play an important role in watershed protection by keeping Wake County's waterways litter-free, eco-logically viable, and safe for drinking or recreation.
